Project News

The state STAR committee reports that chapter recommendations are due between August 15 and October 15. Begin your search now for a young woman who meets the qualifications and can benefit from this scholarship. And she doesn't have to be going to a four-year college. Applicants who are planning to attend a technical school will also be considered for the STAR scholarship.

Another exciting change is that women who have completed and submitted their STAR application will receive an offer of direct admission plus a generous renewable scholarship from Cottey College! She doesn't have to receive the STAR scholarship, only complete and submit her application. Now that is a wonderful opportunity!

The International Peace Scholarship (IPS), now in its 75th year, has given \$53.5 million to deserving women from 178 different countries! Just last spring, \$2.2 million was granted to 205 recipients. Application information for 2025 will be available on the International website this month, and applications are due by December 15, 2024. Please share the information about IPS with any woman studying in a post graduate degree program who is from a foreign country. Chapters do NOT have to recommend a candidate; we just have to publicize the information and let women know that the funds are available. They will apply online.

Your chapter may be partnered with an IPS student, supporting her through her studies, by donating \$500 and requesting to be a Partner in Peace. This donation is made to our state treasurer, accompanied by the Partners in Peace form.
